

## PEARSALL INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

Texas statute requires every district to publish a report on violent or criminal incidents at their schools. Forty of 57 reason codes for disciplinary action are considered violent or criminal and numbers of incidents must be reported \* to the extent permitted under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g).
